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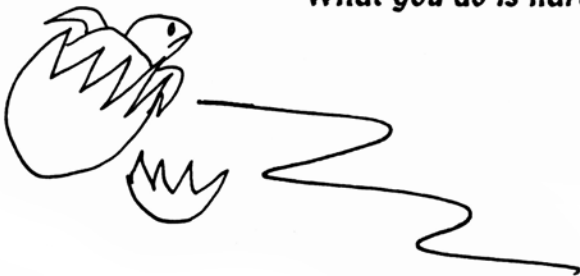
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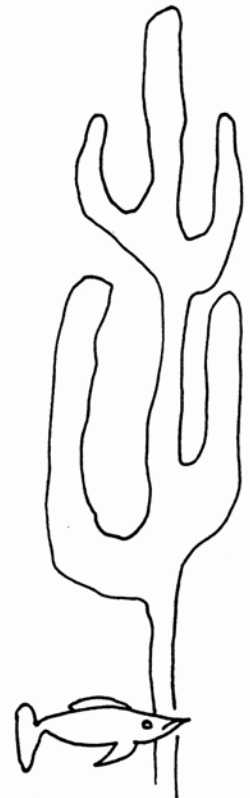
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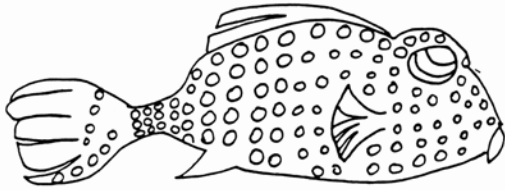
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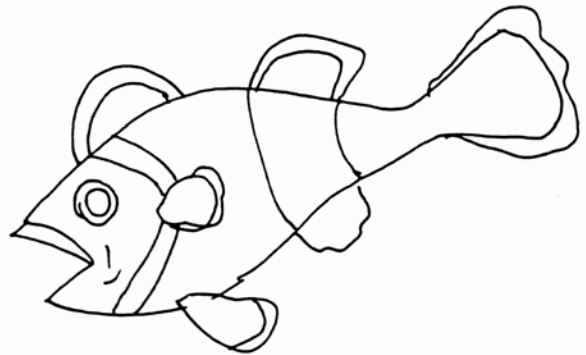
Stripes and Spots

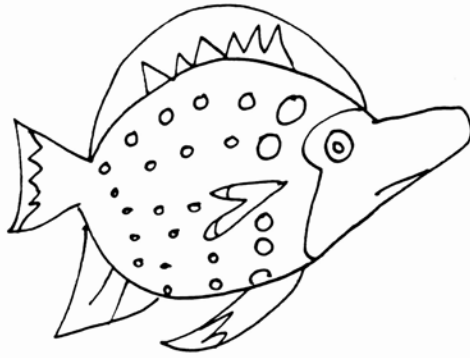
I went to see the fish today

Who makes up these fish designs?*

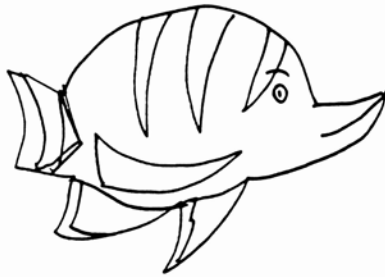
Fins like feet, fins like wings

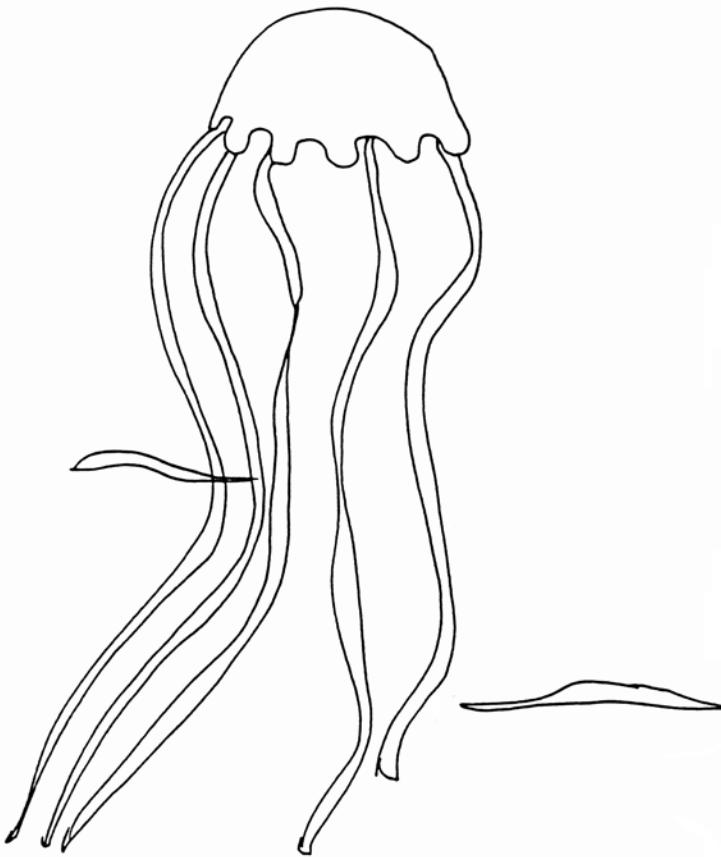




Fish with corners like a box

Fish like little neon signs!

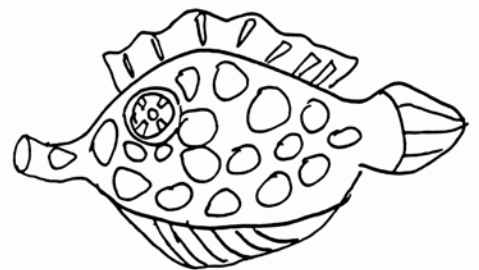


Fish that look like cute cartoons

Sing the Sea!

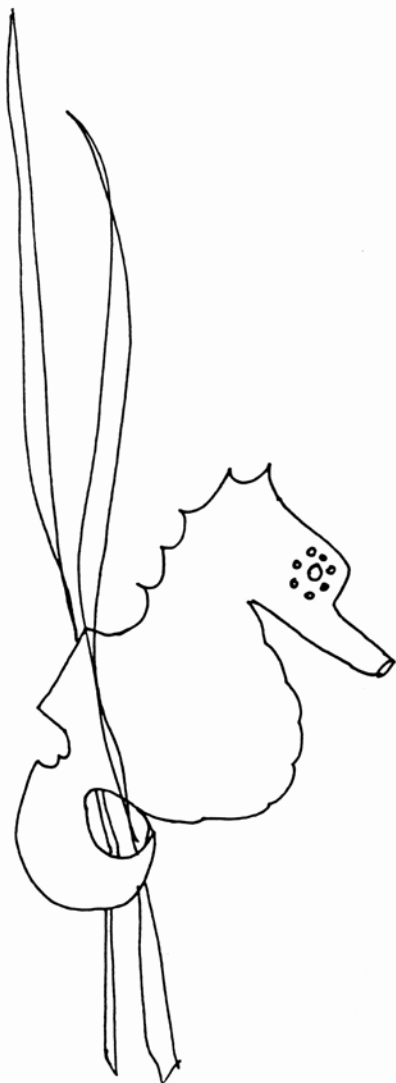
What is it about the sea

In the song that no one wrote.



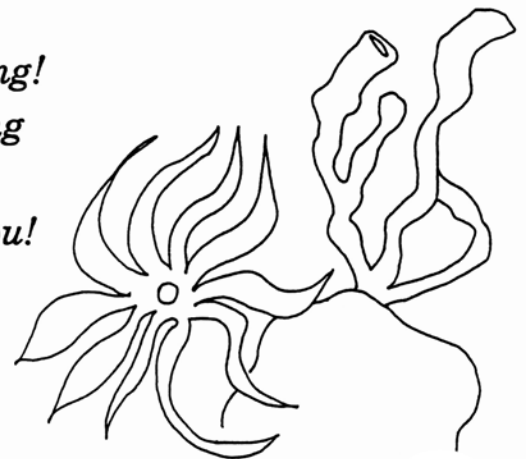
Every player has a part

Little sandy flippers flopping all around.

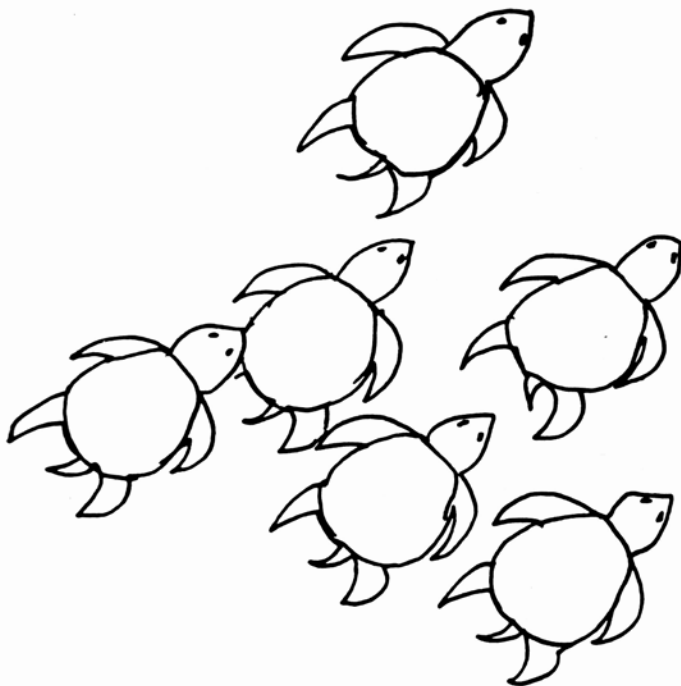
*It's a herd of turtles—did you ever see

They know they're in the place where they should be.

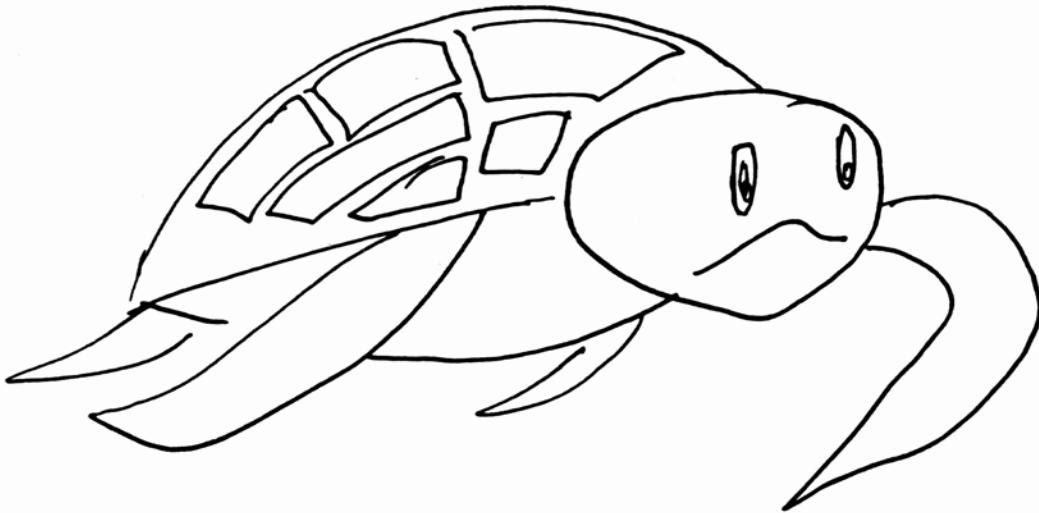
Lots of little turtles swimming in the blue

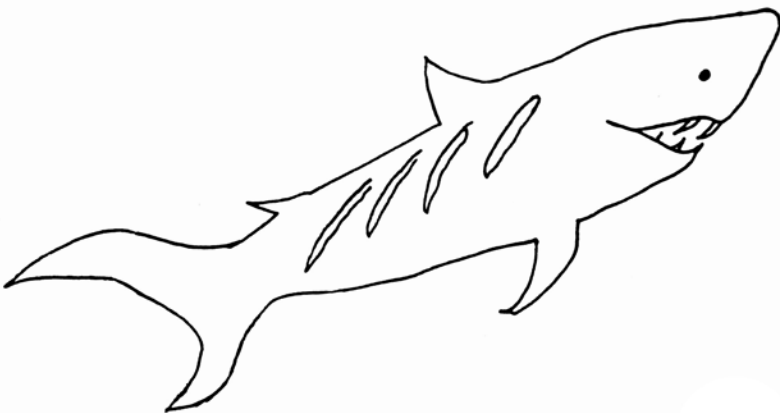
* **Kemp's Ridley** sea turtle is the only one of the seven sea turtle species that comes ashore to nest in daylight. The other species nest at night.

Where Are We?

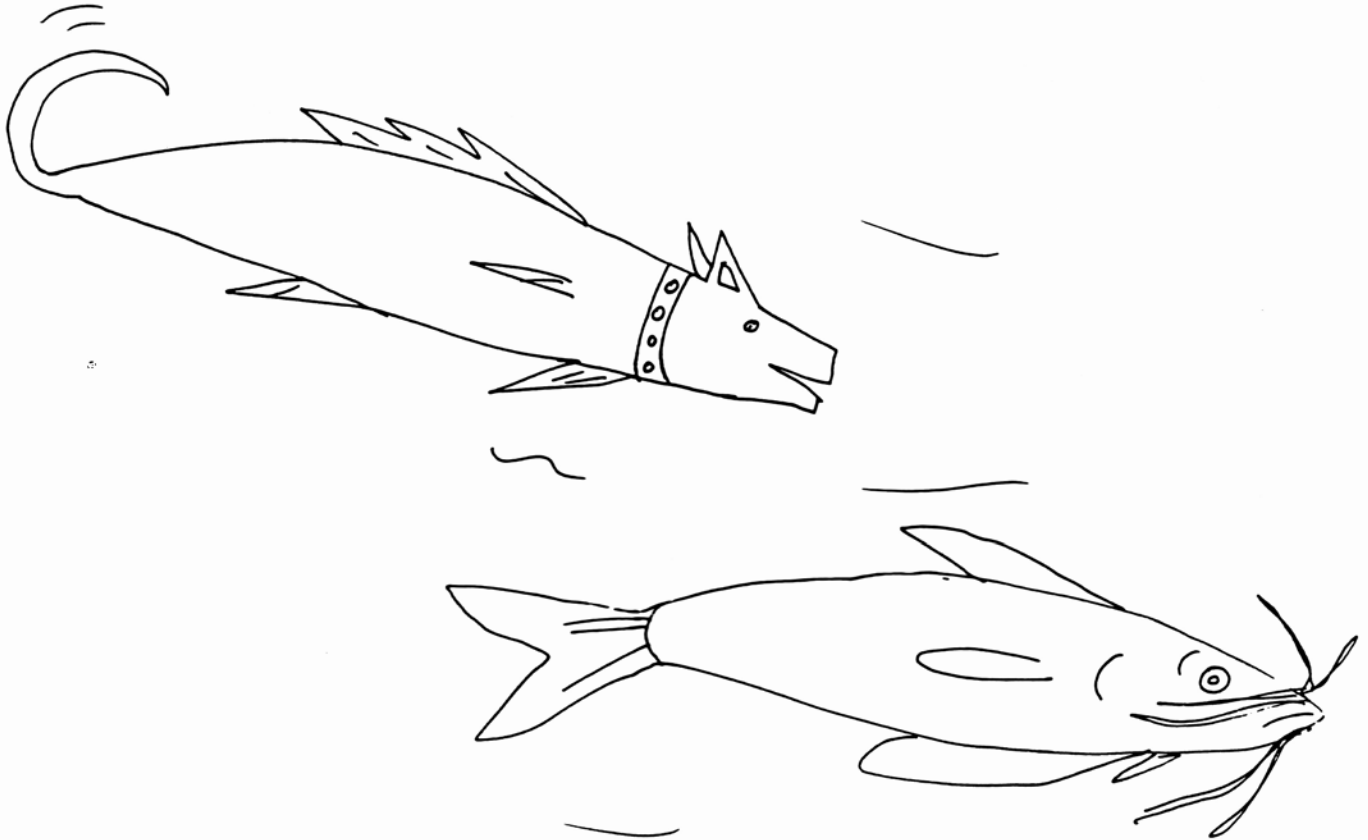
Look at all the fish—at least a zillion different kinds

And look out for that tiger shark—he's swimming straight at you!

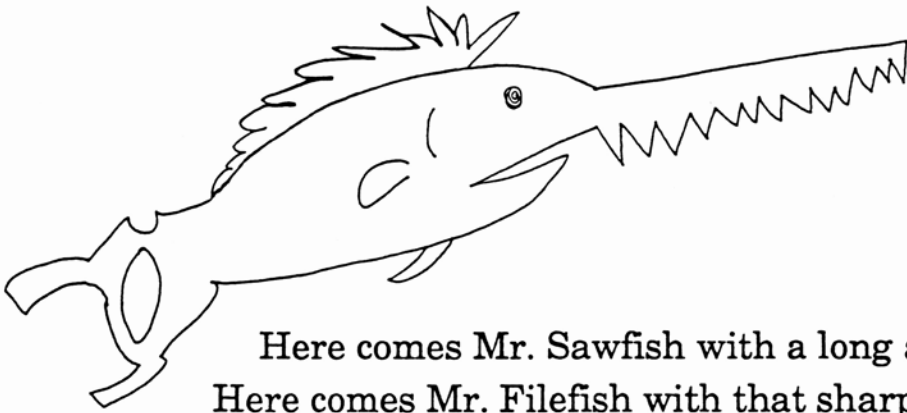
*Goodness me, where are we?

Looking for a sea cucumber when it's time for tea?

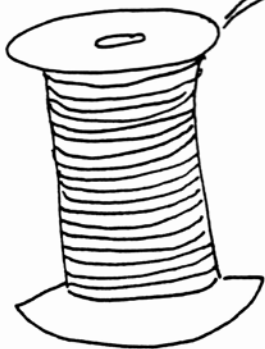


*Goodness me, where are we?

Sounds more like a **TOOLBOX**, if you're asking me!*

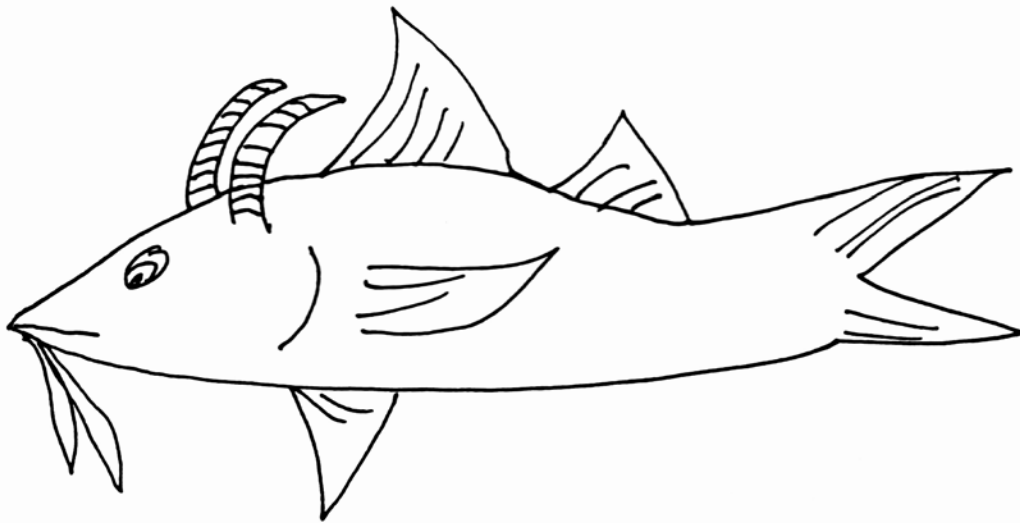


Catfish, dogfish, moonfish, pearlfish

Sounds more like a **BARNYARD**, if you're asking me!*



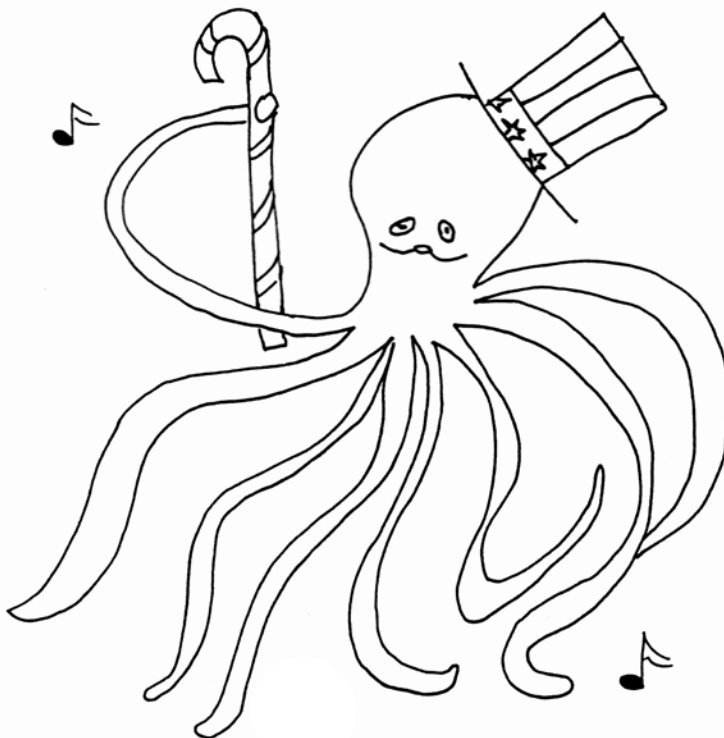

And jellyfish dangle in pink coral trees.

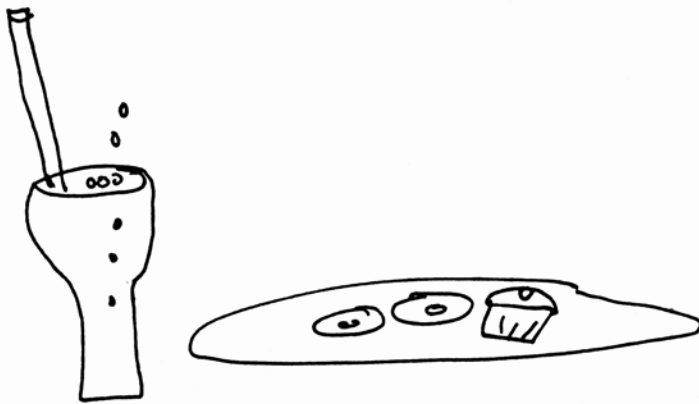
We'll sing with the fiddler crabs playing their tune

And fall in a big tangled heap when we stop.

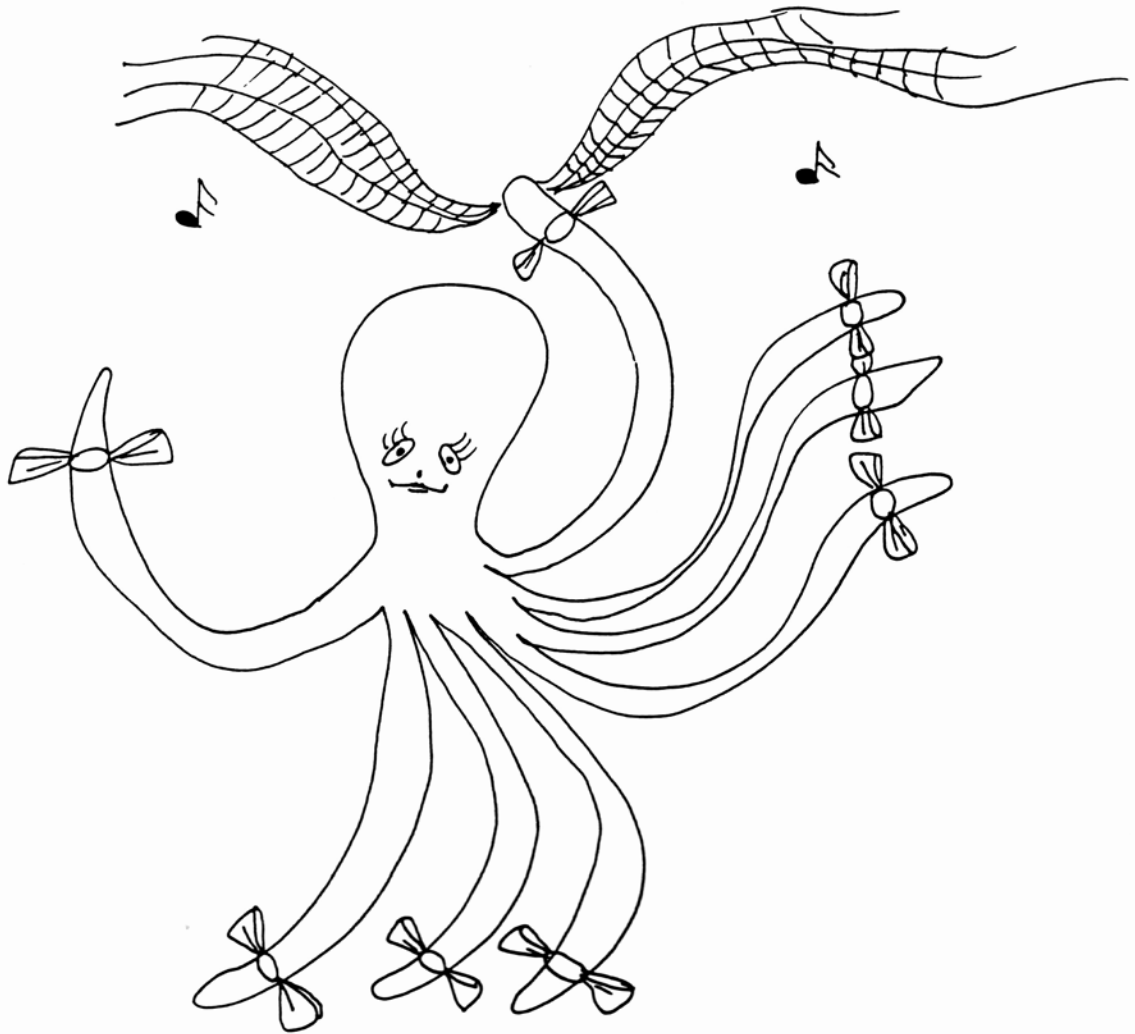
*I'll meet you on Friday at quarter to eight

What's inside that squishy heap?

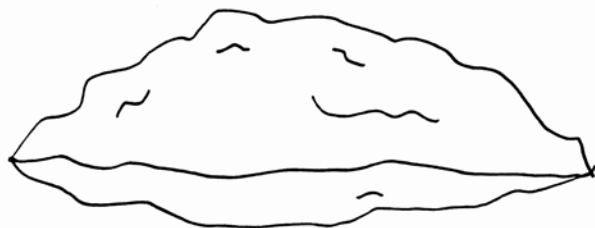
Can they tell the night from day?

You've been hiding long enough!*

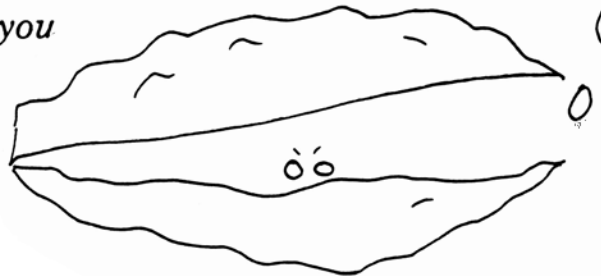


If you can't see and you can't smell

Penguin Town

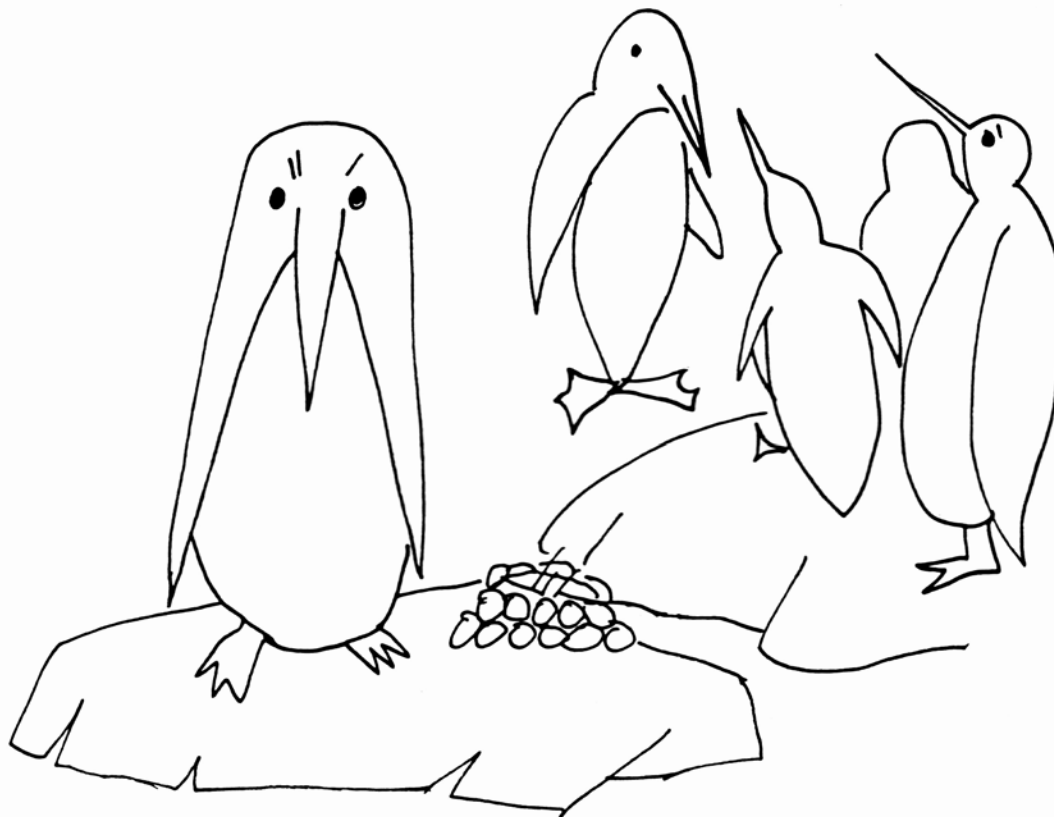
Way down in Antarctica, I guess you've prob'ly heard

And stand around the frozen ground, thinking penguin things.*

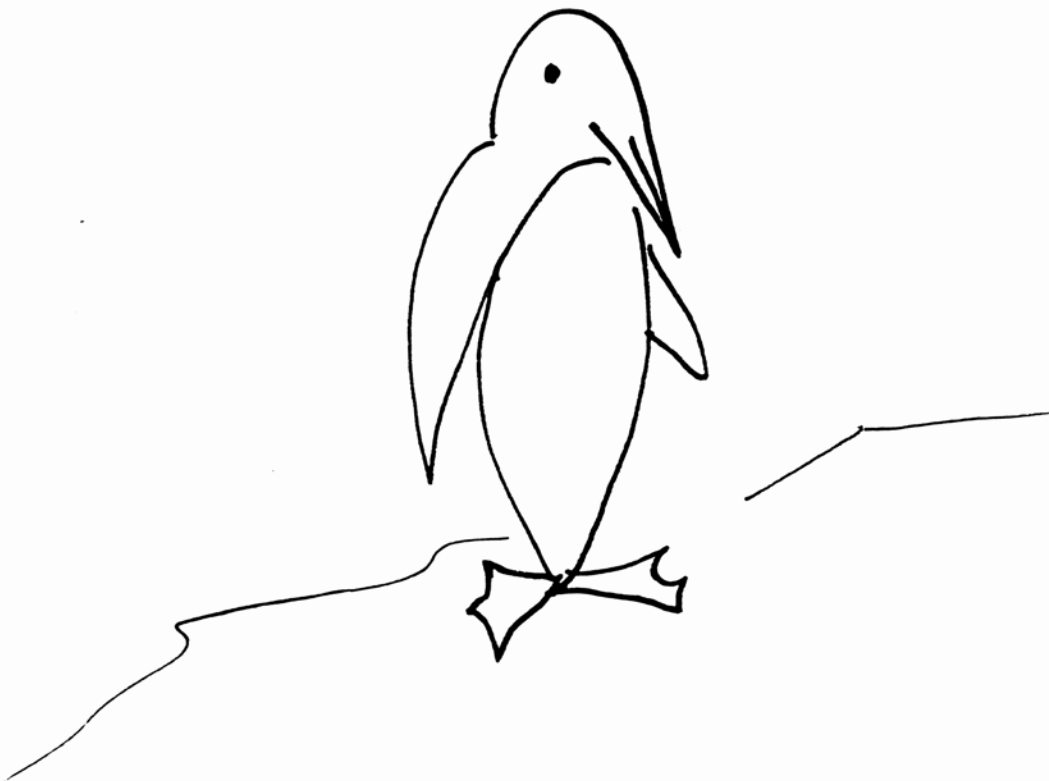


We'll visit penguin parents, tending to their nest

We'll walk like little robots, on little penguin legs.

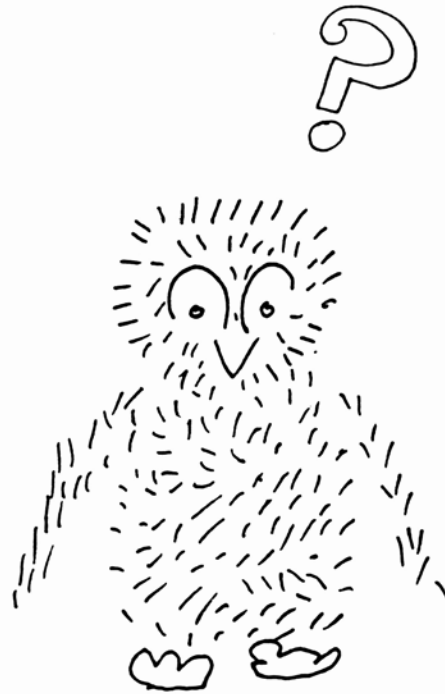


When at last it's dinnertime, we'll hop into the sea

Jump!

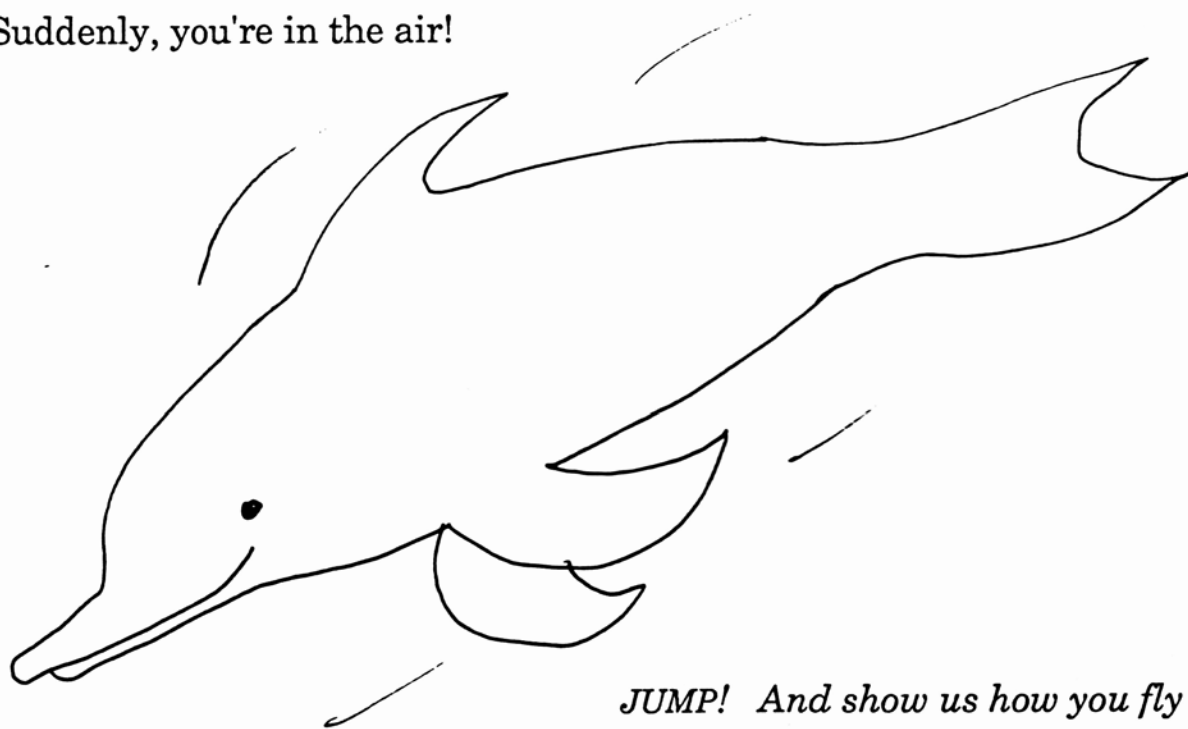
Let's go see the dolphin show

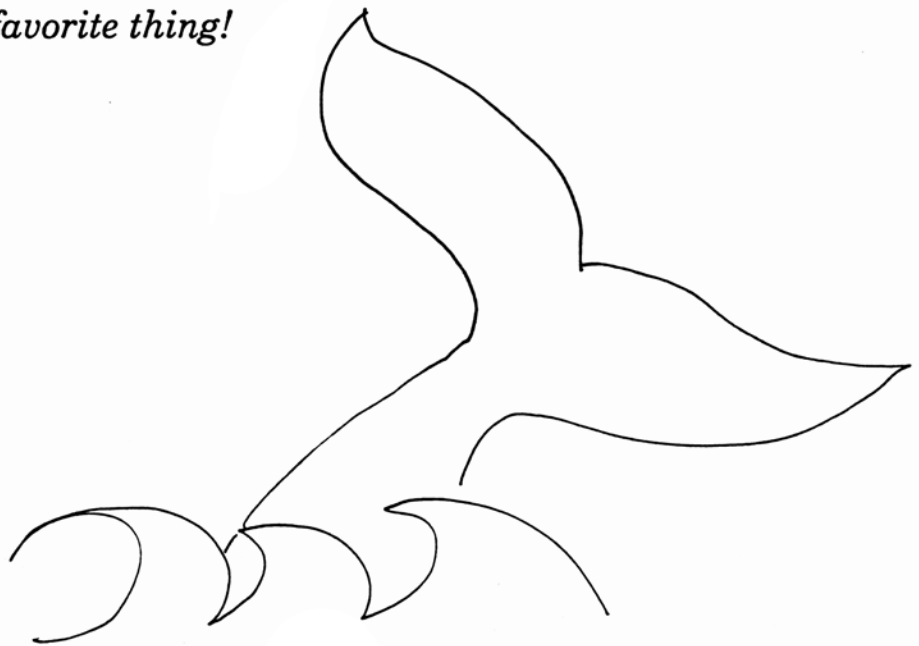
Jump!

And the fish are all waiting for me.

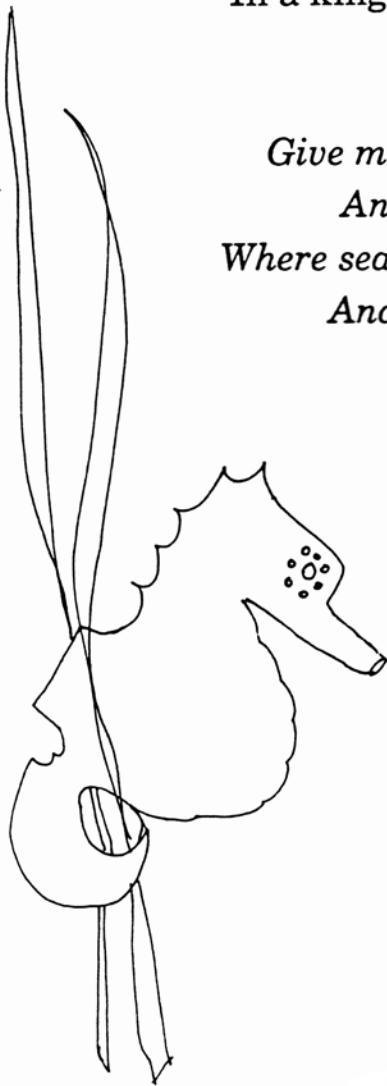
I'll make a wish for a big silver fish

And I'll wake to the song of the sea.



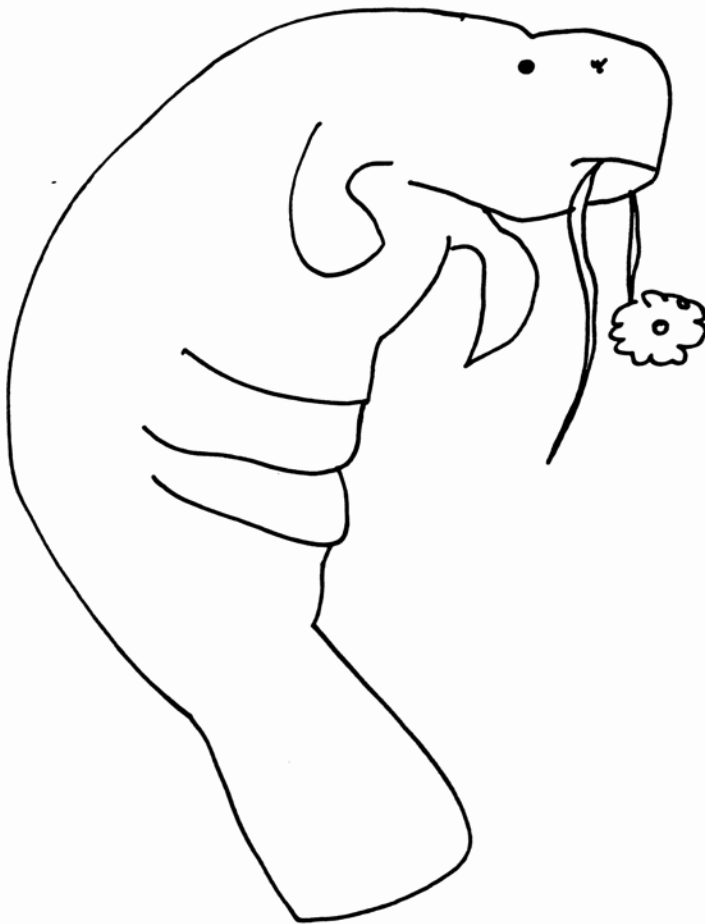
I'll take my chances with octopus dances

'Cause he weighs half a ton!

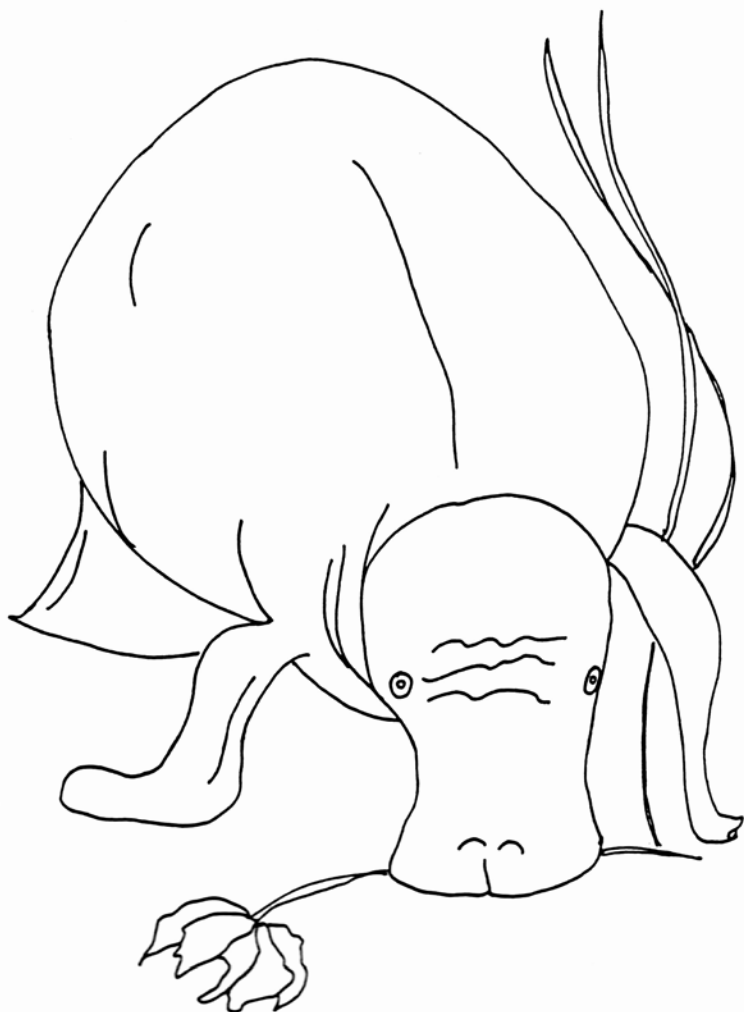
*If you see a manatee

One, two, three—ANEMONE!

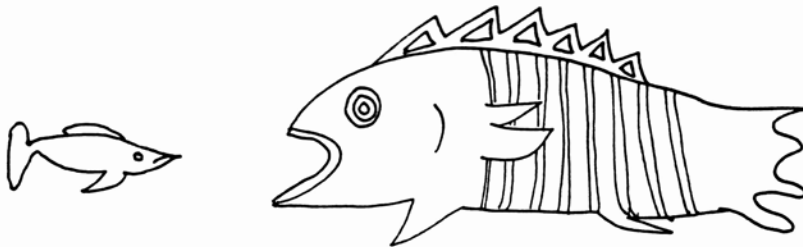
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When You Come

Fish are swimming in your sink!




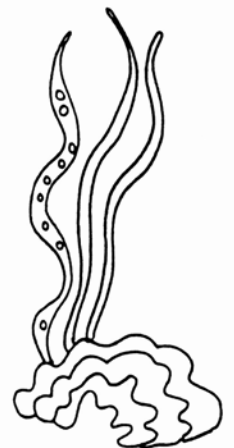
To the Aquarium

What Does It Mean?

(Just in case somebody asks you...)

- anemone** An underwater animal that looks like a little round bush made of tentacles.
- Antarctica** The land at the very bottom of the Earth (where the South Pole is).
- aquarium** A big building where you can go and see lots of different kinds of fish and other things that live in the sea. Visitors look through windows into big tanks of water filled with beautiful fish, coral, turtles, and other sea creatures. It's like being underwater in the ocean, but you don't get wet!
- basic** Plain and simple, not fancy.
- beneath** Under.
- blimp** A huge thing shaped like a long fat balloon that moves slowly through the air, way up in the sky. The pilot steers it from a little room attached to the bottom of the balloon.
- chime** The ringing sound some clocks make when they count the hours at each "o'clock."
- clump** A bunch of something that is all together in the same place.
- color scheme** The colors of something, and the way the different colors are arranged.



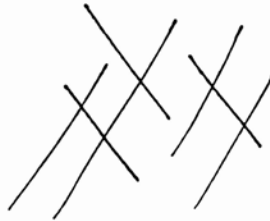
coral Hard, rock-like stuff on the ocean floor that comes in all different shapes and colors. Coral is actually the shells of thousands of tiny creatures all stuck together.

cradled Held warmly and safely, like a baby in a cradle.

crazy eights A card game.

creature Any kind of animal.

criss-cross Shaped like X's.



critter An animal that you think is strange or funny. (It's a silly way of saying **creature**.)

curtsy A very polite, old-fashioned kind of bow that ladies used to do when greeting someone.

dangle Hang loosely and swing, like rope or spaghetti.

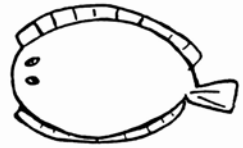
dawn The beginning of the day, when the sun comes up.

dazzle the crowd Make everybody stare and blink because you look so good.

decorate Add things to make something look pretty or fancy.

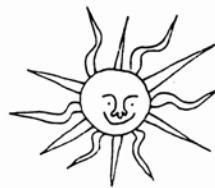
disbelief The feeling of being so amazed about something that you think it can't be real.

- enchanted** Magical.
- evening** The time around the end of the day and the beginning of the night.
- fiddler crab** A kind of crab that has one big claw. When he puts it up to his mouth it looks like he is playing a violin (fiddling).
- final** Last.
- flounder** A flat fish that lies on its side on the ocean bottom. Both eyes are on the same side of its head (the side that's up).
- frilly** Fancy or fluffy, like ruffles, fringe, or lace.
- glide** Move along slowly, without flapping or wiggling.
- glossary** A little dictionary at the end of a book that tells you the meaning of words you might not know. (You are reading a **glossary** right now.)
- grace** A smooth way of moving (**grace** is what you have when you are **graceful**).
- graceful** Moving in a smooth and curvy way, like a fancy skater or a big fish.
- harmony** Musical notes that sound nice when played together, or any combination of things that go well together.
- herd** A bunch of the same kind of animal.



- hold your hats** Get ready for something really wild (because it might make your hat blow off!)
- hotel** A big building with lots of bedrooms where people can stay when they are visiting someplace away from home.
- kingdom** A big area where lots of people or animals live (like a country).
- leopard seal** A kind of seal that likes to eat penguins.
- malt** Short for “malted milk,” an old-fashioned thick sweet drink like a milkshake.
- mermaid** A beautiful lady who has a big fish-tail instead of legs (only in stories, not real).
- mingle** Walk around and talk to lots of different people, like you do at a party.
- misty** A little bit foggy.
- moist** A little bit wet.
- moppy** Stringy and floppy, like a mop.
- mussed** Tangled and messed up.
- neon signs** Lights that look like letters and pictures made of colored lines, like you see in the windows of stores and restaurants at night.

noonday sun Hot sunshine in the middle of the day.



on your mind In your head (like something you are thinking about).

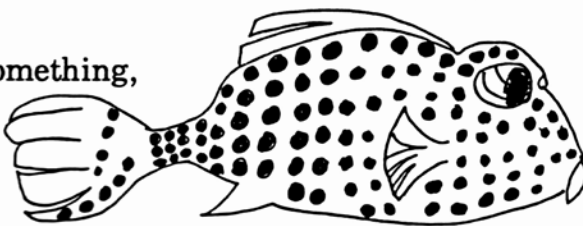
partners Two people who do something together, like dancing or playing a game.

peaceful Quiet, not moving.

pearl A hard, shiny, little white ball that an oyster makes around a speck of sand that gets in its shell, so it doesn't feel so scratchy. Pearls are so pretty that people sometimes wear them as jewelry.

perplexed Confused.

polka dots Lots of round dots all over something, like a dress (or a fish!)



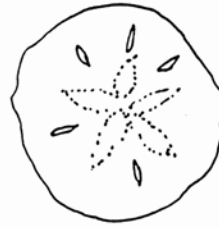
request Something that you ask for.

rhythm The bouncy feel of a song that makes you want to clap or dance.

robot A machine that is shaped sort of like a person and moves in a stiff and jerky way.

romp Jump and play and have fun.

sand dollar A round, flat, white shell that has a star design on it. (It is the skeleton of a flat kind of sea urchin.)



scene All the things you see when you look around. An **underwater scene** is what you see when you are under the water—fish, coral, plants (and if you are near the South Pole, maybe penguins!)

scheme The way things are arranged. (See **color scheme**)

shallows The parts of an ocean, lake, or river that are not very deep.

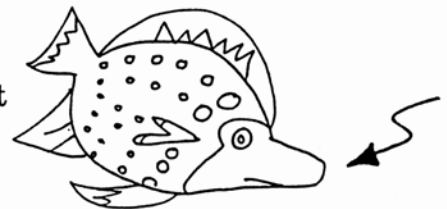
skate A smooth, flat fish that looks like it flies through the water (like a sting ray).

skimp Not use enough of an ingredient when you're making something. (When you make chocolate chip cookies, you should never **skimp** on the chocolate chips!)

slide The **slide** is a kind of dance where you slide your feet in a special way.

snoopy Curious, and sticking your nose into everything to find out what it is.

snout The part of an animal's face that sticks out and has a nose on the end of it.



spiky Sharp and pointy, like a spike (which is like a nail).

spine	A sharp thing like a needle. Some fish have spines growing out of their fins or bodies, to protect them from other fish that might eat them. (Another meaning of spine is the long bumpy bone down the middle of your back.)
spirit	Your mood or feelings.
stubby	Short and fat, and not pointed at all.
style	The way you look and act.
submarine	A boat that can go completely under the water and not get any water inside (looks sort of like an underwater blimp).
surface	The outside of something. The surface of the ocean is where the waves are, the surface of you is your skin.
swirl	A round-and-round movement in air or water—like a tornado, or the way water goes down the drain.
swoop	Move in a way that is smooth, straight, and fast.
symphony	A very long song that has lots of instruments playing at the same time and lots of different moods, but no words.
take my chances	Do something that's a little bit scary and hope it will be okay.
tenderly	Carefully and gently, with a loving feeling.

- tentacles** Long wavy arms that some sea creatures have, like jellyfish, octopuses, and anemones.
- tide** The ocean water near the shore that gets deeper and shallower at different times of the day.
- tidewater pool** A shallow pond of water on the shore that becomes separated from the ocean when the tide goes down.
- ton** Two thousand pounds (very heavy!)
- wacky** Crazy.
- waltz** A kind of dancing where your feet feel like they are going "one-two-three." (It also means a party where people do this dance.)
- winding up** Going around and around, getting ready to do something.
